





Increasing Student Numbers





Mobiles Phones at SNA

- •Zero tolerance approach to any student in possession of a mobile phone at SNA.
- •Excellent compliance from students who bring phones to school, many students keep phones at home (encouraged).
- •Smartphones are not required at secondary school. All learning platforms can be accessed from any device.
- •SNA have reflected carefully on whether our mobile phone approach is enough, and can we do more as a school to deter smartphone addiction in youngsters?

Mobiles Phone pouch trial

- •From September 2025, Y7 students have been undertaking a phone pouch trial
- Mobile phones are locked away for the duration of the school day
- Locked prior to entering the school site and reopened when departing school
- Trial very positive so far, with positive feedback from staff, students and parents
- SNA to look at wider year groups roll out following the trial
- All future year groups to SNA will be Smartphone free




