Why History?

History offers a fascinating opportunity to explore the events, people, and ideas that have shaped the modern world. From revolutions and empires to political ideologies and social change, the course encourages critical thinking about the past and its relevance today. You'll develop a wide range of transferable skills including research, analysis, argument construction, and source evaluation—skills highly valued by universities and employers alike. History is a respected subject by Russell Group universities and complements a wide variety of other A-Level subjects.

What can I expect?

You will study a range of historical periods and themes, both British and international. Topics taught are the Early Tudors, French Revolution and Civil Rights in the USA. You'll explore how historians interpret the past, evaluate primary and secondary sources, and construct well-supported arguments. A key component of the course is the Historical Investigation (NEA)—an independent research project on a topic of your choice, allowing you to explore an area of personal interest in depth.

What do I need?

In addition to the general entry requirements for the Sixth Form, we recommend a grade 5 or higher in GCSE History. Students with a grade 4 will be considered on a case-by-case basis, especially if they demonstrate strong literacy and analytical skills.

What about the future?

History is a gateway to a wide range of careers. History graduates are highly employable due to their ability to think critically, communicate effectively, and understand complex issues.
