

Homework Policy 23-24

Rationale – Why is Homework important?

"Homework is not an optional extra, but an essential part of a good education."

1999 White Paper, Excellence in Schools

Homework is work that is set to be done outside the timetabled curriculum. It contains an element of independent study and is crucially important in raising student achievement by enabling students to develop essential study skills pivotal to academic success.

Aims – Homework enables pupils to......

- Consolidate and extend work covered in class or prepare for new learning activities.
- Access resources not available in the classroom.
- Develop research skills.
- Have an opportunity for independent work.
- Show progress and understanding.
- Enhance their study skills e.g. planning, time management and self-discipline.
- Take ownership and responsibility for learning.
- Engage parental co-operation and support.

How will Homework be set?

Homework will be set verbally in class by class teachers. All homework will then be added to ClassCharts. This website allows parents and students to see what homework has been set for their child, accompanying instructions and advice, links to supporting documents (e.g. video clips), and when the homework is due in.

ClassCharts (Web site or App)

Students and Parents can access the website by using the link on the school web site, via the ClassCharts App, or via a search engine in a browser. The free ClassCharts app can be downloaded via I-Tunes and Google Play stores. The app allows users to access their homework on a variety of mobile devices and is the preferred method of access for SNA parents and students. SNA will provide all parents with login details for ClassCharts access.

There is also a free app for Show My Homework that can be downloaded via I-Tunes and Google Play stores. The app allows users to access their homework on a variety of mobile devices.



Students who do not have internet access at home will be able to access the website through the school ICT systems and will be able to attend the study support and homework sessions. These homework sessions take place before and after school or students can use the school library computers to complete homework during break time or lunchtime.

Monitoring of Homework

Student Rewards – Students will be rewarded for their homework in a variety of ways in line with the school rewards policy.

Student Sanctions – If students do not complete homework they may receive sanctions in line with the school behaviour policy.

Homework is not optional, as it is so crucial in helping all learners reach their potential.

Internal Monitoring of Homework – The quality of homework will be regularly checked by school leaders through a variety of quality assurance procedures.

The role of the Parent

The role of the parent is crucial if a child is to experience success from homework. To reinforce its value through positive feedback will give students the confidence to persevere, work hard and reach high standards of achievement.

Parents can assist by:

- 1. Providing a table, chair and a quiet place to work.
- 2. Negotiating with the student when homework is to be done as a student's free play is important too.
- 3. Checking the time spent on individual tasks.
- 4. Checking presentation and content of all homework being returned to school.
- 5. Monitoring and tracking the homework setting and completion by using the Show My Homework parent facility

Homework Expectations

Year 7 Homework Expectations

The amount of time will vary between each piece of homework set. This information will be provided on the ClassCharts platform. Homework completion time for an individual piece of work in Y7 may range from 5 minutes to 60 minutes.



- English Minimum of 1 piece of homework per week
- Maths Minimum of 1 piece of homework per week
- Science Minimum of 1 piece of homework per week
- Modern Foreign Language 1 piece of homework per week per language subject
- Geography 1 homework per week
- History 1 homework per week

For the subjects listed below, homework will be set when appropriate, but the regularity and frequency of homework will be dependent upon the lesson content and the amount of out of school hours learning required at a particular time. As above, homework completion time for an individual piece of work in Y7 may range from 5 minutes to 60 minutes.

- PSHE
- Art
- RE
- Design Technology/Food
- Drama
- PE
- Computing
- Music

Year 8 + 9 Homework Expectations

The amount of time will vary between each piece of homework set. This information will be provided on the ClassCharts platform. Homework completion time for an individual piece of work in Y8/Y9 may range from 5 minutes to 60 minutes.

- English Minimum of 2 pieces of homework per week
- Maths Minimum of 2 pieces of homework per week
- Science Minimum of 2 pieces of homework per week
- Modern Foreign Language 1 or 2 pieces of homework per week, per language
- Geography 1 homework per week
- History 1 homework per week
- RE 1 homework per fortnight
- Design Technology 1 homework per fortnight
- Art 1 homework per fortnight
- Drama 1 homework per fortnight
- Music 1 homework per fortnight
- Computing 1 homework per fortnight



Key Stage 4 (Years 10-11) Homework Expectations

All subjects will set homework each week. The day on which the homework is set will be dependent upon which day a student studies the subject. Each piece of homework will take approximately 30-60 minutes to complete.

- English Minimum of 2 pieces of homework per week
- Maths Minimum of 2 pieces of homework per week
- Science Minimum of 2 pieces of homework per week
- Option Subjects Minimum of 1 piece of homework per week

Key Stage 5 Homework Expectations

Students will be expected to complete between 4-5 hours of homework per subject per week. This may be a combination of set tasks, revision activities, independent research or wider reading. Students can complete this work either during their designated study periods or at home.

Homework Club

Located in the Library

Time: Monday-Thursday, 3pm-4pm (Pupils are to pack away and help tidy up 5 Minutes before the end of the session in order to leave promptly).

Homework club is open after school for all pupils to access in order to partake in quiet study or access equipment for school/homework purposes only. Members of staff are on duty to supervise and are available to offer support to pupils with homework.

Pupils must sign in upon arrival to homework club and write down what work they have bought to complete. This will be checked by a member of staff. If a pupil arrives without any class/homework to complete they will be asked to help with tasks in the Library/Learning Centre. If there are no tasks they will be sent home. This prevents disruptions to other pupils who have come to work and preserves the ethos of the Homework Club.

After 3:40pm, pupils may access the selection of board games/books we have, providing they have completed all homework. There are to be NO games played on the computers, with the exception of the educational ones that are accessed in class.



Should the library be full, a homework club, students will be able to access a computer room to complete their homework instead. Both facilities are supported by a SNA member of staff.

Homework club is a very positive and friendly environment and we are delighted to be offering this to our pupils.
